

DEPARTING FROM A CANADIAN AIRPORT? COVID-19 MEASURES IN EFFECT

No traveller who is symptomatic of COVID-19 will be allowed to fly.

Requirements for Air Travel

The Government of Canada has several measures in place to limit the spread of COVID-19 and ensure the safety of air travel such as:

- Requiring all passengers to wear a mask at the screening checkpoint, during the boarding process, in-flight, and when deplaning.
- Conducting health checks of all passengers before boarding.
- Denying boarding to symptomatic passengers or those who have been refused boarding in the past 10 days due to a medical reason related to COVID-19 or are subject to a mandatory quarantine order as a result of recent travel or as a result of a local or provincial health order.
- Denying boarding to passengers who refuse to answer questions related to the health check, who are not in possession of a mask, or to those who refuse to comply with an instruction given by a gate agent, airport security screening personnel, or a crew member with respect to wearing a mask.

Important: A COVID-19 test result is not required to board a flight in Canada unless you're flying to a country that requires it.

Suspension of Vaccination Requirements

Vaccination is no longer required to board a plane in Canada. Other public health measures, such as wearing a mask, continue to apply and will be enforced throughout a traveller's journey.
