

# DEPARTING FROM A CANADIAN AIRPORT? TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT

The Government of Canada has restrictions in place for travellers departing from specific Canadian airports, for domestic or international outbound travel.

**No traveller who is symptomatic of COVID-19, regardless of citizenship or vaccination status, will be allowed to fly.**

## Find out if you're ready to board

To board a flight within Canada, if you're 12 years and 4 months of age or older, you must:

- Be fully vaccinated with an accepted vaccine;
- Be ready at any point in your travel journey to show your official proof of vaccination;
- Have received your second dose at least 14 full days prior to the day you travel;
- Have no signs or symptoms of COVID-19;
- Wear a mask throughout your entire travel journey, except for brief periods while eating, drinking or taking oral medication.

**Important:** If you qualify as fully vaccinated or are under 12 years and 4 months of age, a COVID-19 test is not needed to board a flight unless you're flying to a country that requires it.

If you indicate to the airline that you're eligible to board, but fail to provide proof of vaccination, you will not be able to board your flight and could face penalties or fines.

## Providing Proof of Vaccination

The Canadian COVID-19 proof of vaccination is a reliable way for Canadians to show their COVID-19 vaccination history when they travel. If you don't have Canadian proof, your proof of vaccination must include the following information:

- full name of the person who received the vaccine;
- the name of the government or organization who issued the proof or administered the vaccine;
- the brand name or manufacturer of the vaccine or of the mix of accepted vaccines; and
- the date you received your second dose, or your first dose of Janssen/Johnson & Johnson.

If your proof of vaccination is not in English or French, you need a certified translation in English or French. Your certified translation must include the stamp or membership number of a professional translation association.

## Foreign Nationals Departing Canada

Until August 31, 2022, an unvaccinated foreign national who was allowed to enter Canada will be allowed to board a flight to depart Canada provided they show proof of a valid COVID-19 test result at the time of travel.

No person should board a flight if feeling ill as they could potentially put others at risk. Should symptoms such as a fever, cough or difficulty breathing develop while in flight, please notify the flight crew immediately.
